d. **Projects Update**

Police Department

Mr. Lawson said we have hired another certified officer, proving our strategy with the new budget is working. He says all of our new hires say they are happy to be working here.

Visitor Center Events

Mr. Lawson said the Sling-Shot event was successful, commenting that the participants love to visit this area. He said an auction was held at the end of the night to raise money for flood victims of Eastern Kentucky and raised \$10,000. He said a flood is one of the worst disasters that can happen to people and suggested Council think hard about what the Town can do to help.

Town Projects

Mr. Lawson said both the Big Cherry Trails and Greenbelt Phase V Projects are moving along. He said the work at Bullitt Park is coming together and the park should be ready and look great for the first high school home football game of the season.

Blue Highway Fest

Mr. Lawson said the festival is moving along. He said there have been some concerns about the size of the buses and other equipment so we are considering making another entrance near the ball fields to make it easier for tractor-trailers to move in and out.

Eagle Scout Projects

Mr. Lawson said we received a letter outlining what our local Eagle Scouts (Troop 604) have done as their special project:

Benjamin Palmer Hersel constructed six benches for the baseball fields at Bullitt Park.

Christopher Charles Moore worked with Union Primary School to construct dumpster pads for bear-proof dumpsters.

Chadwick Grant Wilson worked with the Town to construct three steel benches for Oakview Cemetery, now known as the Joseph Garfield Long, Sr. Memorial Cemetery.

Daniel Steven Goldman worked with the Trinity United Methodist Church to construct three outdoor community pantries.

Mr. Lawson said he and Mayor Johnson will send a letter to Troop 604 commending the accomplishments of these young men and expressing our appreciation for their efforts.

Town Events

Councilman Bloomer asked about progress on the skate park. Mr. Lawson said a meeting is scheduled for Wednesday at 3 pm. at which time he should learn what bids have been put out and the status of the project.

Councilman Gilley asked how many Sling-Shot vehicles we had at the gathering. Mr. Lawson said there were 140 that signed up and they all went different routes throughout the weekend such as Pound, Kentucky, Lee County, Duffield, and Keokee. He said he thought there were about 63 in Town at one time.

Mr. Lawson said there will be a Grand Opening on Thursday, August 18th at 6 pm to celebrate Sweet Winks move to a new location at 20 East 5th Street South and to welcome Tighten Up Stay Beautiful, which will be located inside Sweet Winks.
