f. Projects Update

ARPA Bonus

Mr. Lawson said employees were very thankful to the Town and Council for the ARPA bonus they received this month.

Big Cherry Lake

Mr. Lawson said there was some vandalism at Big Cherry Lake. Apparently someone cut the locks and stole the batteries from the camera system. He said we are trying to get the video to look for any evidence. He said we plan to put alarms on the boxes to indicate when someone is trying to get into them.

He said he and Mr. Broskey met with representatives from the Department of Mines Minerals and Energy (DMME) regarding the AMLER grant we have been awarded. He said they asked for better maps because they couldn't determine the route we have planned. He confirmed that the Devil's Bathtub is an eligible site – the forest trails to Big Cherry – Straight Fork Loop and Century Road – are already existing trails and will be connection points. He said the site itself runs from the watershed to Devil's Bathtub. He said they discovered that any funds put into the budget for engineering can be moved later if we need to, but anything put into construction cannot be moved so he said we will update our budget to make sure we can move some items around if we need to during the project. The bad news is that we are probably looking at two years before we get any money from the grant.

Christmas Events

Mr. Lawson reminded everyone of the Employee Lunch this Thursday at noon. Our annual Christmas party for employee children will follow at 6 pm that evening. All children under 15 who are members of employee's family are invited. Council may bring their children or grandchildren if they wish.

He said we had bought some shirts for Council members but when they came in they were not exactly what we wanted so we will make a few small changes and reorder them. He asked for updated shirt sizes from Council members.

He said the first night of the Greenbelt-In-Lights rides took about 152 people around the Greenbelt. The second night around 364 people rode the circuit, but an additional 70 people left because of the long lines.

Mr. Lawson showed Council the Christmas cards we are sending out this week. He asked them to give him a list of anyone they wish to add to our list.

Enterprise Business Loan

Mr. Lawson said he met with the business owner that we gave an Enterprise Business Loan in 2017 to inform them the lien would not be released for the \$10,000 payment they intend to make. He told them we will not do that until the loan is fully paid. The business owner anticipated paying off the loan by mid-February. He said if they pay the principal, he will discuss with Council the possibility of waiving a portion of the interest and late fees.

Britalians Film Crew

Mr. Lawson said a team from Britalians will be here on December 21st thru the 23rd to film downtown. He said we will try to do a major cleanup of the sidewalks and streets before they come.

"Wing Walk"

Mr. Lawson said an idea was presented to him to incorporate with getting the DORA process going this year. It involved a "Wing Walk" that will start at Moon Dog's then move down the street to the next restaurant serving wings in the DORA area. Each person in the group will take turns paying for an order of wings at each spot, with the group filling out scorecards to

rate each restaurant according to specific criteria, such as best bar, best sauce, etc. He said it's a step toward getting the businesses to develop more ideas to get people visiting and walking around downtown.

Gap Partnership

Gap Partnership has an officers meeting scheduled for tomorrow with their regular monthly meeting on Thursday at the 404 Café.

Council Workshop

Mr. Lawson pointed out that the next scheduled Council Workshop will be on January 3rd, the day after New Year's Holiday. He asked if Council wished to hold the meeting as scheduled or cancel it. The consensus was to leave the Workshop scheduled as is.

Food Bank

Mr. Lawson said that prior to COVID, the Food Bank was serving 185-200 people per month. During the COVID months, they only served around 70 people per month. Now that things are getting back to normal regarding the virus, the Big Stone Gap Food Bank is serving 200-215 people per month on a regular basis. However, Feeding America, which helps fund the local food banks, has cut their funding to the pre-pandemic level which has left their supplies extremely low. Mayor Johnson said he has not seen their supply shelf this low before. As a result, they have asked us to make an additional donation of \$1,000 from our discretionary fund. Mr. Lawson said he plans to reach out to Feeding America to explain the situation to try to get their funding back up to normal. He asked Council what they wish to do.

Motion by Hughes, seconded by Lyke, that the Town make an additional one-time donation of \$1,000 to the Big Stone Gap Food Bank to help alleviate the loss of funding and enable them to restock their shelves. Motion resulted as follows:

Mr. Lawson reminded everyone that if they have a church group or a family group they can get a special ride around the Greenbelt if they will call the Visitor Center to schedule the ride.

Mayor Johnson said it was great watching the kids enjoy their time with Santa at the Visitor Center and said the Grinch was a big hit too. He thanked everyone involved in making it happen. He thanked Council for the donation to the Food Bank – he said it is greatly needed. He wished everyone a Merry Christmas.
